




Figure 3: Annual Ridership Comparison





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location **Ridership by Stop** Roberts Elementry Einstein Medical UM Middle School/Springhouse & Keebler UM Highschool at Prince Frederick & Stonybrook UM Township Building(Library) Anderson and Henderson Anderson and Dartmouth Dartmouth and Cambridge Brownlie and Henderson Jasper and Bernard UM Community Center/Senior Center Regimental and Caley General Steuben and Valley Forge Deer Creek Heuser Park Valley Forge Towers (2000 Building) Lafeyette Valley Forge Apts. Valley Forge Casino The Children's Hosp of Philadelphia, KOP(CHOP) The Village at Valley Forge(Main St and Bryce Lane) Wegmans Walmart United Artists Movie Theater (Goddard Blvd) King of Prussia Plaza (JCPenney Trans Ctr) Wills Road at Costco KOP Court (Court Blvd) KOP Medical Center (Allendale Rd) Kingwood and Flintlock 251 DeKalb Acme at DeKalb Plaza Valley Forge Shopping Center **Target Front Entrance** ALDI Giant at Henderson Sq. Village Mart B and Flinthill Road Jefferson and 4th St. 20 40 60 80 100 120 140





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location



Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison









Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location

Figure 1: Annual Ridership Comparison




Figure 2: Who is riding the Rambler?





Figure 3: Embark and Disembark by Stop Location



RE: Rambler Ridership Analysis

Through August, the Rambler's 2024 ridership has reached 81% of pre-Covid (2019) ridership numbers, which is higher than both the national and regional average. According to the American Public Transportation Association (APTA)'s <u>Policy Brief</u> on 2024's first quarter public transportation ridership, the average weekly ridership recovery in 2024 fluctuated between 73% and 79% of 2019 numbers when compared to the same week. SEPTA's highest reported ridership recovery month so far was <u>June 2024</u>, which reached 75% of pre-Covid numbers.

Ridership increased steadily from 2021-2023 (see below chart). Through August, 2024's ridership is 16% higher than 2023's ridership over the same period:





An analysis of the ridership numbers indicate that, in 2024, ridership is consistent across the days of the week. Of the 5,169 riders so far in 2024, the breakdown is as follows:

Monday: 836Tuesday: 814Wednesday: 946Thursday: 912Friday: 811Saturday: 850

The most popular stops in 2024 are: (Embark/disembark)

- Lafayette Valley Forge Apartments (898/767)
- Valley Forge Towers 2000 Building (684/641)

- Dartmouth and Cambridge (0/0)
- Roberts Elementary (2/4)
- Anderson and Henderson (5/2)
- Anderson and Dartmouth (13/0)
- Valley Forge Shopping Center (4/13)
- Heuser Park (7/11)

A large percentage of riders are using the Rambler to access shopping centers, medical appointments, and recreational activities.

Public transportation is an investment that has a 5-to-1 economic return, and an average of 87% of trips nationwide directly benefit the local economy (APTA, 2023).
